	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

46	members serving a term of 4 years and 2 members serving a term of 5 years. <u>Alternate members serve without terms</u> . The term of the member who serves as chair is without limit.

 16 7. Alternate members. Alternates are empowered to hear cases and carry out other duties of the board when regular board
 18 members from the same category are unable or unwilling to carry out those duties. The chair shall select alternate members to

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SUMMARY

This bill makes technical amendments to the Maine Motor Vehicle Franchise Board laws to provide for alternate members and to clarify that the board has adopted its own adjudicatory rules, which makes the board exempt from parallel Maine Administrative Procedure Act requirements.
