SUMMARY

This amendment revises the pilot program proposed in the resolve to require the Maine Community College System to establish a pilot program for the education of individuals who are interested in enrolling as candidates in an entry-level nursing preparation program and who have also expressed the goal of attaining a license as a registered nurse. The pilot program may also provide education for entry-level candidates for the nursing preparation program who are interested in future employment in long-term care as registered nurses. The pilot program would be operated at 2 community college locations in the State. The amendment also requires that a scholarship fund be established with private donations to provide eligible students with funds to participate in this pilot program and provides that the Maine Health Care Association and the Maine Community College System work together to provide leadership for raising these scholarship funds.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill includes General Fund appropriations of \$180,000 in fiscal year 2005-06 and \$160,000 in fiscal year 2006-07 for the Maine Community College System to establish the pilot program at two community college locations for the education of 8 registered nurses at each site. The System estimates the annual cost to deliver the program to be \$80,000 per site with an additional one-time cost of \$20,000 in fiscal year 2005-06 for curriculum development.
