18	COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A to S.P. 141, L.D. 417, Bill, "An
20	Act To Improve the Role of Boards of Visitors for State Correctional Facilities"
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24	Amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated " §3002. " in subsection 1 by inserting after paragraph C the following:
26	' <u>D. At least one member of each board must be a person</u> licensed by this State to provide mental health services.'

30	Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated " <u>§3002.</u> " in subsection 1 by relettering the paragraphs to read consecutively.
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34	Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated " <u>§3002.</u> " in subsection 2 by striking out all of paragraph A and inserting in its place the following:
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38	'A. Each board of visitors shall inspect the correctional facility to which it is assigned. Each board of visitors
40	must be provided open access to all physical areas of the correctional facility, including access to areas housing clients. Each bound of minitum must be memided the
42	clients. Each board of visitors must be provided the opportunity to speak to clients and to staff. Members of the board chall comply with all departmental policies and
44	the board shall comply with all departmental policies and procedures and facility security practices regarding access to the correctional facility shall adhene to all fodered
46	to the correctional facility, shall adhere to all federal and state law regarding confidentiality and shall refer concerns or complaints regarding specific individuals to the
48	chief administrative officer or advocate.'

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

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Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "<u>§3002.</u>" in subsection 2 in paragraph D in the 4th line (page 2, line 19 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "officers" and 4 inserting in its place the following: 'officer'

Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "<u>\$3002.</u>" in subsection 2 in paragraph D by striking out all of 8 the last underlined sentence (page 2, lines 24 to 27 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following: 'Boards of visitors may 10 meet jointly.'

Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated 14 "<u>\$3002.</u>" by inserting after subsection 2 the following:

'3. Visit to correctional facilities and communications 16 with clients and staff. A member of a board of visitors may visit the correctional facility to which that board is assigned 18 and may speak with clients and with staff. The member shall 20 comply with all departmental policies and procedures and facility security practices regarding access to the correctional facility, 22 shall adhere to all federal and state law regarding confidentiality and shall refer concerns or complaints regarding specific individuals to the chief administrative officer or 24 advocate.'

Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "<u>\$3002.</u>" in subsection 3 in the first line (page 2, line 32 in 28 L.D.) by striking out the following: "3." and inserting in its place the following: '4.' 30

Further amend the bill by inserting after section 2 the 32 following:

Sec. 3. Application. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 34-A, section 3002, subsection 1, paragraph C, a 36 current member of a board of visitors who is an employee of the Department of Corrections may continue to serve on a board until 38 March 15, 2006 or until a new member is appointed, whichever is 40 sooner.'

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SUMMARY

This amendment makes the following changes to the bill.

It specifies that at least one member of each board be a 1. licensed provider of mental health services. 48

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 2. It creates an application provision to allow current board members who work for the Department of Corrections to
4 continue to serve for a period of time after the enactment of the bill to allow for continuity of board work until new appointments
6 are made.

3. It makes organizational changes to improve readability.
