An Act To Exempt Certain Religious, Nonpublic, Postsecondary Institutions from Licensure

2	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 4	Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §10708, sub-§§2 and 3, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 693, §§5 and 8, are amended to read:
6	2. Federal reservations. Offer programs or courses which
8	<u>that</u> are conducted solely on a federal reservation over which the Federal Government has exclusive jurisdiction. The commissioner shall authorize exempt status under this subsection; and
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12	 Noncredit courses. Offer courses or programs which that are not for academic credit. and
14	Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §10708, sub-§4 is enacted to read:
16	4. Religious, nonpublic, educational institution. Meet the
18	<u>following criteria.</u>
20	A. The educational institution must be substantially owned, operated or supported by a bona fide church or religious organization.
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24	B. The educational programs of the educational institution must be primarily designed for, aimed at and attended by persons who seek to learn the particular religious faith or
26	beliefs of the church or religious organization under paragraph A.
28	C. The programs under paragraph B must be intended to
30	prepare students to assume leadership positions in, or enter into some other vocation closely related to, the particular
32	<u>faith of the church or religious organization under</u> paragraph A.
34	The exemption under this subsection does not apply to any
36	educational institution that represents to any student or prospective student that the major purpose of its program is to
38	<u>prepare the student for a vocation not closely related to the</u> <u>particular religious faith of the educational institution or to</u>
40	provide the student with a general educational program substantially equivalent to the educational programs offered by
42	schools or departments or branches of schools that are not exempt from this section.
