SENATE AMENDMENT to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 343, L.D. 468, Bill, "An Act Making Unified Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government, General Fund and Other Funds, and Changing Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 2006 and June 30, 2007"

Amend the amendment by striking out all of Parts PPP, QQQ, RRR and SSS.

Further amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment removes the provisions of the amendment that authorize implementation of collective bargaining agreements, and it removes the part that increases the mileage allowance for employees traveling on state business.

Removing provisions implementing the collective bargaining agreements will constitute rejection of the cost items in those agreements and, pursuant to MRSA Title 26, Section 979-D, require their return to the parties for further bargaining. No additional appropriations and allocations were included in the amended bill for the cost of collective bargaining and, therefore, this amendment will have no net effect on General Fund appropriations and revenue and a balanced budget is maintained for the 2006-2007 biennium.
