Sec. 1. Sea urchin harvesting season. Resolved: That, notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section
 6749, the Commissioner of Marine Resources shall establish by rule the number of open days during which a person may fish for
 or take sea urchins between the effective date of this resolve and March 31, 2007 as follows:

 The commissioner shall initiate rulemaking to establish
 15 open days in Zone 1 and 55 open days in Zone 2, as those areas are designated under Title 12, section 6749-N, for sea urchin
 harvesting between September 1, 2005 and March 31, 2006; and

 After March 31, 2006, the commissioner shall initiate rulemaking to establish the number of open days in Zone 1 and the
 number of open days in Zone 2, as those areas are designated under Title 12, section 6749-N for sea urchin harvesting between
 September 1, 2006 and March 31, 2007. The commissioner shall use the recommendations of the Task Force To Study Sea Urchin Fishery
 Management, established in section 2, as the basis for rules establishing the number of open days under this subsection.

Sec. 7. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Legislative Council shall provide necessary staffing services to the task force; and be it further

Sec. 8. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members 16 of the task force are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses 18 related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the task Public members not otherwise compensated by their 20 force. employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to 22 receive reimbursement of necessary expenses and, upon a demonstration of financial hardship, a per diem equal to the legislative per diem for their attendance at authorized meetings 24 of the task force; and be it further

Within 10 days after its first meeting, the task force shall present a work plan and 46 proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The task force may not incur expenses that would result in the task force's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the task force, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the task force chairs and staff with a

SUMMARY

This amendment is the majority report of the committee. The 38 amendment changes the title and replaces the bill with a resolve. The amendment directs the Commissioner of Marine 40 Resources to initiate rulemaking to establish 15 open days in Zone 1 and 55 open days in Zone 2 for the upcoming 2005-2006 sea urchin harvesting season. The amendment also directs the 42 commissioner to initiate rulemaking, following the 2005-2006 season, to establish the number of open days for the 2006-2007 44 season based on the recommendations of the Task Force To Study 46 Sea Urchin Fishery Management as established in this amendment. The 9-member task force is required to examine the current 48 management structure and strategies of the sea urchin fishery and recommendations regarding short-term make and long-term

management options. The task force is required to make 2 recommendations regarding the sea urchin harvesting season, including the number of open days. The task force is required to 4 submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources and the Legislative Council by February 1, 2006. The Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources is authorized to б report out a bill to the Second Regular Session of the 122nd 8 Legislature following the committee's review of the task force's amendment also report. This adds an appropriations and 10 allocations section to the bill.
