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- Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it
 - Sec. 1. Sea urchin harvesting season. Resolved: That, notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 6749, the Commissioner of Marine Resources shall establish by rule the number of open days during which a person may fish for or take sea urchins between the effective date of this resolve and March 31, 2007 as follows:
 - 1. The commissioner shall initiate rulemaking to establish 10 open days in Zone 1 and 45 open days in Zone 2, as those areas are designated under Title 12, section 6749-N, for sea urchin harvesting between September 1, 2005 and March 31, 2006; and
- 2. After March 31, 2006, the commissioner shall initiate rulemaking to establish the number of open days in Zone 1 and the number of open days in Zone 2, as those areas are designated under Title 12, section 6749-N for sea urchin harvesting between September 1, 2006 and March 31, 2007. The commissioner shall use the recommendations of the Task Force To Study Sea Urchin Fishery Management, established in section 2, as the basis for rules establishing the number of open days under this subsection.

Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A; and be it further

- Sec. 2. Task force established. Resolved: That the Task Force To Study Sea Urchin Fishery Management, referred to in this resolve as "the task force," is established; and be it further
- Sec. 3. Task force membership. Resolved: That the task force consists of 9 members appointed as follows:
- 1. One member of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate, who serves on the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources;

Sec. 7. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Legislative Council shall provide necessary staffing services to the task force; and be it further

Sec. 8. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members of the task force are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the task force. Public members not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses and, upon a demonstration of financial hardship, a per diem equal to the legislative per diem for their attendance at authorized meetings of the task force; and be it further

Sec. 9. Report. Resolved: That, no later than February 1, 2006, the task force shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources and the Legislative Council. The task force is not authorized to introduce legislation. Following receipt and review of the report, the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources may report out a bill to the Second Regular Session of the 122nd Legislature; and be it further

Sec. 10. Extension. Resolved: That, if the task force requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further

Sec. 11. Task force budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the task force, with assistance from the task force staff, shall administer the task force's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the task force shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The task force may not incur expenses that would result in the task force's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the task force, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the task force chairs and staff with a

status report on the task force budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds. Notwithstanding any other law, the Sea Urchin Research Fund, established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 6749-R, must be used to cover the costs of the study; and be it further

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Sec. 12. Funding. Resolved: That notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 6749-R, the State Controller shall transfer \$3,790 at the beginning of fiscal year 2005-06 from the Sea Urchin Research Fund within the Department of Marine Resources to the Legislature to fund the expenses of the Task Force To Study Sea Urchin Fishery Management; and be it further

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Sec. 13. Appropriations and allocations. Resolved: That the following appropriations and allocations are made.

The amendment also directs the commissioner to initiate rulemaking, following the 2005-2006 season, to establish the number of open days for the 2006-2007 season based on the recommendations of the Task Force To Study Sea Urchin Fishery Management as established in this amendment. The 9-member task force is required to examine the current management structure and strategies of the sea urchin fishery and recommendations regarding short-term long-term and

Legislative Study

This legislation includes an Other Special Revenue allocation to the Legislature in the amount of \$3,790 in fiscal year 2005-06. This allocation provides funds for the per diem and expenses of legislative members and expenses of other eligible members of the Task Force to Study Sea Urchin Fishery Management. Funds within the Sea Urchin Research Fund will be transferred to the Legislature to cover the costs of the study.
