An Act To Amend the Charter of the Boothbay Harbor Sewer District

(EMERGENCY)

Presented by Representative BISHOP of Boothbay. Cosponsored by Senator DOW of Lincoln. **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, the Boothbay Harbor Sewer District is a quasi-municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State; and

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Whereas, certain residences and businesses in the Town of Boothbay have private, on-site sewage disposal systems that are inadequate; and

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Whereas, the Town of Boothbay and the Boothbay Harbor Sewer 14 District believe it is in their best interests to extend the territory of the Boothbay Harbor Sewer District to serve the Town 16 of Boothbay; and

18 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 20 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 22 safety; now, therefore,

24 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. P&SL 1961, c. 161, §1, as amended by P&SL 1993, c. 59, §1, is further amended to read:

Sec. 1. Territorial limits; incorporation. The territory, and the inhabitants therein, of the Town of Boothbay Harbor in the County 30 of Lincoln and the territory, and the inhabitants therein, of that-part-of the Town of Boothbay, in the County of Lincoln, 32 which-is-bounded-and-described-as-follows+--Beginning-at-a-point in-the-middle-of-the-intersection-of-Dever-Read-and-State-Reute 34 27+-thence-easterly-a-distance-of-2,000-feet,-more-or-less,-to-a 36 point /- thence - southwesterly - a - distance - of - 10,000 - feet, - more - or less,-to-the-Boothbay-Harbor-town-line; -thence -westerly-along-the 38 town-line -a-distance-of-6,000-feet, -more-or-less, -to-a-point; thence-northerly-a-distance-of-9,000-feet,-more-or-less,-to-a point /- thence-easterly-a-distance-of-5-200-feet,-more-or-less,-to 40 the-point-of-beginning, constitute a public sewerage district and a body politic and corporate under the name of "Boothbay Harbor 42 Sewer District." The purpose of this district, subject to the provisions of section 10, is to take over, control, operate and 44 manage the sewers now owned by the Town of Boothbay Harbor with 46 all appurtenances thereto; to extend, increase, enlarge and improve these sewers; to extend the present system or systems so as to furnish sewerage facilities to parts of the district not 48 now served with those facilities; to provide for removal and 50 treatment of sewage when, as and if that treatment becomes necessary; and generally to construct, maintain, operate
and provide a system of sewerage, sewage disposal and sewage
treatment for public purposes and for the health, welfare,
comfort and convenience of the inhabitants of the district.

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Sec. 2. P&SL 1961, c. 161, §17, 2nd sentence, as amended by P&SL 1991, c. 81, §1, is further amended to read:

The total indebtedness of the district at any one time 10 outstanding may not exceed the sum of \$5,500,000 \$8,500,000.

Sec. 3. Emergency clause; referendum; effective date. In view of 12 the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved only for the purpose of permitting its submission to the 14 voters of the Town of Boothbay Harbor and the Town of Boothbay at 16 an election to be called and held for that purpose by December 31, 2005. The election must be called, advertised and conducted according to the law relating to municipal elections, except that 18 the registrar of voters is not required to prepare or the clerk 2.0 to post a new list of voters. For the purpose of registration of voters, the registrar of voters must be in session the secular 22 day preceding the election. The subject matter of this Act is reduced to the following questions. Question A, which is to be 24 submitted to the voters of the Town of Boothbay Harbor and the Town of Boothbay, must read as follows:

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Question A: "Do you favor extending the territory of the 28 Boothbay Harbor Sewer District to include all of the territory of the Town of Boothbay?"

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Question B, which is to be submitted to the voters within the Boothbay Harbor Sewer District, must read as follows:

34 Question B: "Do you favor amending the Boothbay Harbor Sewer District charter by increasing the debt limit of the 36 district from \$5,500,000 to \$8,500,000?"

Section 1 of this Act takes effect for all purposes immediately upon acceptance of Question A by a majority of the voters of the Town of Boothbay Harbor and a majority of the voters of the Town of Boothbay. Failure to achieve the necessary
approval does not prevent subsequent elections held prior to December 31, 2006. Section 2 of this Act takes effect for all purposes immediately upon acceptance of Question B by a majority of the voters of the Boothbay Harbor Sewer District voting at the election. Failure to achieve the necessary approval does not prevent subsequent elections held prior to December 31, 2006.

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The results of the elections must be declared by the 50 municipal officers of the towns and due certificates of the elections must be filed by the town clerks with the Secretary of State.

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6	SUMMARY
	This bill extends the territory of the Boothbay Harbor Sewer
8	District to include all of the territory of the Town of
	Boothbay. The bill also increases the debt limit of the Boothbay
10	Harbor Sewer District from \$5,500,000 to \$8,500,000.
