32	'Sec.1. 29-A MRSA §2116 is enacted to read:
34	§2116. Distracted driving
36	1. Definition. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, "distracted driving" means operating a motor
38	vehicle on a public way while engaged in an activity not directly related to and in a manner that interferes with the safe
40	operation of the motor vehicle.
42	2. Violation; enforcement. A person who engages in
44	distracted driving commits a traffic infraction. This subsection may be enforced only if a law enforcement officer has detained
46	<u>the operator of the motor vehicle for a suspected moving violation as defined in section 101, subsection 44.</u>
48	3. Preemption. This section supersedes and preempts all
50	municipal ordinances relating to the use of a mobile telephone by an operator of a motor vehicle.'

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 401, L.D. 525

SUMMARY

6 This amendment is a minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation. The amendment replaces the bill and 8 provides a definition of "distracted driving." It provides that a person who engages in distracted driving commits a traffic 10 infraction. It also provides that a distracted driving violation may be enforced only if a law enforcement officer has detained 12 the operator of the motor vehicle for a moving violation. It also preempts municipal ordinances relating to the use of mobile 14 telephones.
