32	It is unlawful for any person, other than the owner or manager, to bring any <u>an</u> animal into a store where food is sold for human consumption or into a restaurant where food is prepared
34	and served on the premises. This section shall does not apply to
36	any a person requiring the services of a seeing-eye-deg <u>service</u> animal.
38	For the purposes of this section, "service animal" means an animal that has been prescribed for an individual with a
40	disability by a physician, psychiatrist or psychologist and a guide dog, signal dog or other animal individually trained to do
42	work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability, including, but not limited to, guiding individuals
44	with impaired vision, alerting individuals with impaired hearing to intruders or sounds, providing minimal protection or rescue
46	work, pulling a wheelchair or fetching items.'
