An Act To Prohibit an Insurer from Cancelling an Insurance Policy due to Ownership of Certain Breeds of Dog

Be it enacted by the People of th	e State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 24-A MRSA §3060	is enacted to read:

## §3060. Actions related to ownership of certain breeds of dogs prohibited

1. Cancellation or nonrenewal prohibited. An insurance company authorized to transact business in this State may not cancel, refuse to issue or renew or charge an increased premium for a property insurance policy subject to this subchapter solely on the basis of a policyholder's ownership of a certain breed of dog. This subsection does not apply if the dog owned by the policy holder has been designated as a "dangerous dog" as defined in Title 7, section 3907, subsection 12-D.

#### 18 SUMMARY

This bill prohibits the cancellation or nonrenewal of a property insurance policy solely on the basis of a policyholder's ownership of a certain breed of dog. The bill also prohibits an increase in the premium for the policy. The bill's provision do not apply if a dog has been designated as a "dangerous dog" in accordance with state law.
