Prior to ordering a shipment of wine, the wine 2 connoisseur permit holder shall provide the nearest licensed wine wholesaler with the opportunity to distribute the wine 4 the permit holder desires to a retailer within 20 miles of the permit holder's residence that sells wine for off-premises consumption. If the licensed wine wholesaler 6 does not identify a retailer within 20 miles of the permit 8 holder's residence within 48 hours, the permit holder may have the wine shipped directly from the winery. 10 B. The holder of the wine connoisseur permit shall confirm with the winery that the shipment will be conspicuously 12 labeled to indicate that the contents of the package include 14 wine and may be delivered only to the intended recipient. 16 C. The wine shipment must be delivered by common carrier, as defined in Title 12, section 6001, subsection 8. The 18 common carrier is authorized to make delivery of the wine to the holder of the wine connoisseur permit after the permit 20 holder presents the common carrier with the wine connoisseur permit and proof of the permit holder's identity. 22 D. Within 30 days of receiving a shipment, the holder of a 24 wine connoisseur permit shall submit to the bureau a copy of the receipt for that shipment and submit all applicable 26 taxes along with a tax form provided by the bureau. E. The wine connoisseur permit holder shall retain a 28 receipt for each transaction under this section for 2 years 30 and provide the receipt to the bureau upon request. 32 2. Permit fee. The fee for a wine connoisseur permit is \$50. The annual renewal fee is \$25. 34 3. Waiver of fee. The bureau may waive the permit fee if 36 an applicant for a wine connoisseur permit provides proof that the applicant made a purchase within the previous 6 months from a farm winery licensed in accordance with section 1355. 38 40 4. Compliance with beverage container deposit law. The bureau is authorized to adopt rules so that wine bottles 42 delivered to the holder of a wine connoisseur permit comply with the beverage container deposit law pursuant to Title 32, chapter 44 28. Rules adopted in accordance with this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 46 2-A. 48 5. Bureau to provide name of nearest wholesaler. In accordance with subsection 1, paragraph A, the bureau shall 50 provide to a wine connoisseur permit holder upon issuance of the

permit the name of the licensed wine wholesaler nearest to the home address of the permit holder. 2

6. Violation. A person violates this section if, after 4 receiving notice from the bureau to cease and desist, the person continues the activities in violation of this section. A person 6 who violates this section commits a civil violation for which a 8 fine of not more than \$500 may be adjudged. A person who violates this section after having previously violated this section commits a civil violation for which a fine of not more 10 than \$2,500 may be adjudged.'

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SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill and is the minority report of the committee. This amendment establishes a wine connoisseur 18 permit. This permit provides that a person may have up to 12 20 cases of wine shipped from in-state or out-of-state wineries by way of a common carrier. The fee for a wine connoisseur permit 22 is \$50 and the annual renewal fee is \$25. The holder of a wine connoisseur permit is required to pay all applicable taxes and 24 must retain records of wine shipments for 2 years. The amendment requires the holder of a permit to provide the nearest wine 26 wholesaler the opportunity to obtain the wine. The wholesaler would have 48 hours to identify a retail location where that wine 28 would become available for sale. This amendment provides that the fee for the permit is waived if the applicant for the permit 30 shows proof that the applicant made a purchase from a farm winery in Maine within the previous 6 months. Finally, this amendment 32 grants routine technical rulemaking authority to the Department of Public Safety, Division of Liquor Licensing and Compliance to ensure that bottles of wine received using a wine connoisseur 34 permit comply with the bottle deposit law.
