An Act To Amend the Law Regarding Fishing Derbies

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §12504. sub-§3. as enacted by PL 2003, c. 414, Pt. A, $\S2$ and affected by c. 614, $\S9$, is amended to read: 4 6 3. Rules. The commissioner shall adopt all necessary rules relative to permits to ensure that derbies and tournaments are 8 conducted only at such times and places and in such a manner as are consistent with the fisheries management objectives of the 10 department. For the purposes of this subsection, "educational institution" means an accredited postsecondary educational 12 institution incorporated, chartered or established under the laws of the State. Such rules must include: 14 Α. Specifying the number of derbies or tournaments that may 16 be conducted in a given body of water and the dates within which they may be conducted. These rules must be reviewed periodically; and 18 20 Fixing the maximum total value of prizes that may be Β. awarded at each derby or tournament, except for a derby held by an educational institution that conforms to the 22 rules adopted pursuant to paragraphs C, D, E, F and G; 24 C. Requiring that at least 80% of the prizes awarded at a derby held by an educational institution be in the form of 26 scholarships; 28 D. Prohibiting the use of a motorboat in a derby held by an educational institution; 30 32 E. Prohibiting the targeting of cold-water species in a derby held by an educational institution; 34 F. Requiring that a derby held by an educational institution be an event that is only catch and release or 36 catch, measure and release; and 38 G. Restricting fishing equipment to one rod per person with a 2-rod limit per boat and to the use of artificial lures 40 only in a derby held by an educational institution. 42 SUMMARY 44 46 accredited postsecondary educational This bill exempts institutions that hold fishing derbies from the prize limits set by the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife for derbies 48 if the derby event meets the following requirements: 50

1. Participants may not fish from motorboats; 2 2. Participants may only use artificial lures; 4 3. The derby must be an event that is only catch and 6 release or catch, measure and release; 4. Participants may target only warm-water species; 8 5. There is a limit of one rod per person and a maximum of 10 2 rods per boat; and 12 6. At least 80% of the prizes awarded are in the form of scholarships. 14
