Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

6	1-A. Chiropractic acupuncture. "Chiropractic acupuncture"
	means the insertion of acupuncture needles through the skin at
8	specific points <u>; the application to the skin, according to</u>
	acupuncture techniques, of microelectric current, magnetic
10	stimulation, moxibustion and other forms of heat therapy;
	therapeutic uses of sound and light; cupping techniques; and
12	acupressure techniques. It Chiropractic acupuncture is a
	ehiropractic methodology used for the correction of the soft
14	tissue components contributing to subluxation and the
	accompanying physiological or mechanical abnormalities. Except
16	as provided in section 502, chiropractic acupuncture may only be
	practiced by a licensee who has received a chiropractic
18	acupuncture certification from the board.
