2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §1752, sub-§6-C** is enacted to read:

6 **6-C. Motor home.** "Motor home" means a motor vehicle that:

8 **A. Is originally designed, reconstructed or permanently altered to provide facilities for human habitation; or**

10 **B. Has a camper permanently attached to it.**

12 **"Motor home" does not include a mobile home as defined in Title 29-A, section 101, subsection 35.**

14 **Sec. 2. 36 MRSA §1765, sub-§9,** as amended by PL 1999, c. 518, §2, is further amended to read:

18 **9. Camper trailers, motor homes and truck campers.** Camper trailers, motor homes and truck campers.

20 **Sec. 3. Application.** That section of this Act that amends the
22 Maine Revised Statutes, Title 36, section 1765, subsection 9
24 applies to transactions occurring on or after July 1, 2006.

26 **SUMMARY**

28 This bill proposes to allow a sales tax trade-in credit for motor homes.
