COMMITTEE AMENDMENT ' to H.P. 456, L.D. 623

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Title. The individual assisting the applicant shall prepare and sign the registration application or form, along with an 2 alternative registration signature statement, at the applicant's 4 direction, in the presence of the applicant and one corroborating witness. The individual assisting the applicant and the б corroborating witness must be registered to vote in the State, but neither may be a candidate, the applicant's employer or an 8 agent of that employer or an officer or agent of the applicant's union. The alternative registration signature statement form 10 must be designed by the Secretary of State and must indicate that: 12 A. The applicant is unable to sign the applicant's name because of a physical disability;

- B. The applicant meets all the gualifications to become a
 16 registered voter in the State or to make the requested
 changes to the voter's registration; and
- C. The information supplied on the form concerning the 20 applicant is true.

22 2. Alternative application for voter who becomes unable to sign after being registered. A voter who becomes unable to sign that voter's name because of a physical disability after being registered to vote and who wishes to change the voter's 26 registration or enrollment status may do so by using a signature stamp or by authorizing another registered voter to sign on the 28 voter's behalf if the voter files with the voter registration application or form an alternative registration signature 30 statement prepared in accordance with subsection 1.

Signing petitions. Once an alternative registration 32 3. signature statement is on file with the registrar, the voter may 34 authorize any other Maine-registered voter to sign candidate petitions and any Maine Clean Election Act forms requiring a 36 voter's signature in the presence and at the direction of the voter, except that the individual assisting the voter may not be 38 the circulator of the petition or form, the voter's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of the voter's union. In addition to using the voter's signature stamp or 40 signing for the voter, the individual assisting the voter must 42 print and sign the individual's own name and residence address on the petition or form and attest that the individual is signing on the voter's behalf. This method of signing satisfies the 44 requirements in this Title that voters personally sign candidate petitions. 46

the registrar to provide that assistance. If the applicant or voter is unable to appear at the office of the registrar, the registrar shall visit the individual to provide that assistance, upon request and with reasonable notice. The municipality shall pay the registrar travel expenses at the same rate paid other municipal employees.

Sec. 4. 21-A MRSA §335, sub-§7, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 161, §6, is amended to read:

The circulator of a primary petition shall verify by Α. oath or affirmation before a notary public or other person authorized by law to administer oaths or affirmations that all of the signatures to the petition were made in his the circulator's presence and that to the best of his the circulator's knowledge and belief each signature is the signature of the person whose name it purports to be; each signature authorized under section 153-A was made by the authorized signer in the presence and at the direction of the voter; and each person is enrolled in the party named in the petition and is a resident of the electoral division named in the petition.

Sec. 5. 21-A MRSA §354, sub-§7, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 161, $\S6$, is amended to read:

A. The circulator of a nomination petition shall verify by 28 oath or affirmation before a notary public or other person authorized by law to administer oaths or affirmations that all of the signatures to the petition were made in his the circulator's presence and that to the best of his the 32 circulator's knowledge and belief each signature is the signature of the person whose name it purports to be; each 34 signature authorized under section 153-A was made by the authorized signer in the presence and at the direction of 36 the voter; and each person is a resident of the electoral division named in the petition.' 38

SUMMARY

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This amendment provides a legal framework and a process for a person who is unable to sign that person's name due to a physical disability to be able to register to vote and sign candidate petitions.

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
