SUMMARY

18 This amendment is the minority report of the committee. The amendment replaces the bill with a resolve. The amendment directs the Public Utilities Commission to allocate \$75,000 from 20 the state universal service fund to hire a consultant to conduct 22 a needs assessment and to assist federally qualified health centers in applying for funds from the federal Universal Service Fund to meet their telecommunications services needs. The 24 amendment requires the Public Utilities Commission to report, no 26 later than March 1, 2007, to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over telecommunications matters on the results of the needs assessment and applications for 28 federal funds. The amendment authorizes the committee to report 30 out a bill on this subject to the First Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature after review of the report.

This legislation authorizes the use of \$75,000 from the Maine Universal Service Fund to pay for a consultant and to assist federally qualified health centers in applying for federal funding. It also authorizes the Public Utilities Commission to collect the \$75,000 to implement this resolve. Funds contributed to the state universal service fund are not state allocated funds and are administered by an outside entity. Costs associated with the additional requirements of the Public Utilities Commission can be absorbed by the commission utilizing existing budgeted resources.
