An Act To Allow Qualified Health Centers To Obtain Telecommunications Education Access Funding

2 Sec. 1. 35-A MRSA §7104-B, sub-§1. ¶D is enacted to read: 4 "Qualified health center" means a federally qualified D. 6 health center or a health center that provides free public access to health care services in medically underserved areas if the commission determines, in consultation with the 8 Department of Health and Human Services, that including the 10 health center as a qualified health center is in the public interest. 12 Sec. 2. 35-A MRSA §7104-B, sub-§2, as amended by PL 2001, c. 14 522, $\S1$, is further amended to read: 16 2. Authority. Pursuant to the authority granted in section 7104 and in order to carry out the policy goals established by 18 section 7101, subsections 1, 2 and 4, the commission shall establish a telecommunications education access fund, referred to 20 in this section as the "fund," and require all telecommunications carriers offering telecommunications services in the State and 22 any other entities identified by the commission pursuant to subsection 8 to contribute to the fund. The fund must be 24 available, with any accumulated interest, to qualified libraries, qualified schools, qualified health centers and the Raymond H. Fogler Library at the University of Maine to assist in paying the 26 using advanced telecommunications costs of acguiring and technologies. 28

6	qualified health centers to the list of entities eligible to
	receive funding from the telecommunications education access
8	fund. It also adds to the guidelines for the Public Utilities
	Commission to use in allocating money from the fund the provision
10	of telecommunications equipment and increased bandwidth necessary
	to support electronic health records and telemedicine in rural,
12	medically underserved areas.
