4	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §1819-A is enacted to rea
б	§1819-A. Day use passes for certain veterans
8	Notwithstanding section 1819, the comm

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commissioner shall enter into a memorandum of agreement with the Department of Defense, 10 Veterans and Emergency Management for the issuance of a free day use pass to state parks and historic sites to each veteran 12 determined by the Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management to meet the criteria established in Title 37-B, 14 section 6. The pass entitles the holder, and the holder's spouse and children when accompanied by the holder, to admission free of charge to all state parks and historic sites for the period 16 described in Title 37-B, section 6. This section is repealed 18 June 30, 2010.

Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §10853, sub-§13 is enacted to read:

22 13. Certain veterans. The commissioner shall enter into a memorandum of agreement with the Department of Defense, Veterans 24 and Emergency Management for the issuance of a free resident hunting license and a free resident fishing license to each 26 veteran determined by the Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management to meet the criteria established in Title 37-B, section 6 and other criteria for issuance of licenses. 28 Each license is valid for the period described in Title 37-B, 30 section 6. This subsection is repealed June 30, 2010.

Sec. 3. 37-B MRSA §6 is enacted to read:

34 §6. Issuance of free day use pass and licenses

36 The Commissioner of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management, in accordance with a memorandum of agreement entered into with the Commissioner of Conservation and this section, 38 shall issue a free day use pass to state parks and historic sites 40 to eligible veterans. The commissioner, in accordance with a memorandum of agreement entered into with the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and this section, shall issue a 42 free fishing license and free hunting license to eligible 44 veterans who meet other criteria of the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife for the issuance of licenses. 46

1. Eligibility. The Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management shall determine, based on an examination of 48 an individual's discharge certificate from active duty services, 50 also known as the DD214, whether the following criteria are met:

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A. The person is a resident of this State;

- B. The person received an honorable discharge or general discharge under honorable conditions; and
- C. Between October 1, 2001 and January 1, 2010, while a8member of the Maine National Guard or an active or reserve
member of the uniformed services as defined in 10 United10States Code, Section 101(a)(5), the person served for a
minimum of 3 continuous months outside the United States12either:
- 14 (1) On an operational mission for which members of the reserve were ordered to active duty; or
 16
- (2) During a period of war declared by the United18States Congress or a period of national emergency
declared by the President of the United States or20Congress.

22 2. Duration of passes and licenses. A license or pass issued in accordance with this section is valid for a minimum of
 24 12 months from the date of an eligible veteran's discharge from active duty. The memoranda of agreement between the departments
 26 may allow issuance of passes or licenses for a period longer than 12 months.

3. <u>Responsibilities of commissioner</u>. The Commissioner of 30 Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management shall identify a point of contact within the department to issue licenses and passes in accordance with this section and the memoranda of agreement 32 entered into with the Department of Conservation and the 34 Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. The commissioner shall periodically report to the Department of Conservation with 36 a listing of the names and addresses of all persons receiving passes to state parks and historic sites and the expiration dates 38 for those passes. The department shall periodically report to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife with a listing of 40 the names and addresses of all persons receiving fishing licenses and hunting licenses and the expiration dates for those licenses. 42

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- 4. Repeal. This section is repealed June 30, 2010.

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Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the

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preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.'

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 204, L.D. 649

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SUMMARY

4 This amendment is the majority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry. It replaces the bill with a directive to the Department of Defense, Veterans 6 and Emergency Management to enter into a memorandum of agreement with the Department of Conservation for the issuance of free day 8 use passes to certain veterans and to enter into a memorandum of agreement with the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife 10 for the issuance of free hunting licenses and fishing licenses to 12 certain veterans. It establishes criteria for eligibility to receive the free pass and licenses. The provisions for the complimentary pass and licenses are repealed June 30, 2010. 14
