Resolve, Regarding Nonnative Invasive Marine Species

Sec. 1. Nonnative invasive marine species. Resolved: That the 2 State and all appropriate agencies of State Government shall participate in the development of state and regional strategies to prevent introduction of nonnative invasive marine species into 4 the coastal waters of the State and the greater Gulf of Maine 6 ecosystem and to work to eliminate or mitigate the negative of impact the nonnative invasive marine species where 8 introduced. A11 appropriate state agencies involved with managing or studying Maine's marine environment, its harvests and 10 its related commerce are encouraged to prevent the introduction of nonnative invasive marine species and to work to eliminate or 12 mitigate their negative impacts by continuing to develop science-based strategies and promoting collaborative problem 14solving with other appropriate agencies and governments; and be it further 16

Sec. 2. Report. Resolved: That the Department of Marine 18 Resources in consultation with the Department of Environmental Protection shall report to the Joint Standing Committee on 20 Natural Resources by February 1, 2006 concerning the nature and extent of the problem of nonnative invasive marine species in 22 Maine waters. The departments shall submit a brief summary of issues and efforts to control nonnative invasive marine species 24 in the New England area, a description of the existing legal for regulation of ballast framework discharges, any 26 recommendations for changes to Maine law to better address ballast discharges and other issues related to nonnative invasive 28 marine species. The Joint Standing Committee on Natural Resources has the authority to report out a bill regarding nonnative invasive marine species to the Second Regular Session 30 of the 122nd Legislature.

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SUMMARY

This resolve requires all the appropriate agencies in the 36 State to participate in the development of practices and procedures to ensure that nonnative invasive marine species are 38 not introduced by ships entering the Gulf of Maine.

 This resolve also requires the Department of Marine Resources in consultation with the Department of Environmental
Protection to submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Natural Resources by February 1, 2006 on issues related to
nonnative invasive marine species.
