An Act To Require Agricultural Representation on the Maine Tourism Commission

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 4	Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §13090-F, sub-§1, as amended by PL 2003, c. 198, §10, is further amended to read:
6	1. Maine Tourism Commission. The Maine Tourism Commission, established by section 12004-I, subsection 87 and referred to in
8	this section as the "commission," shall assist and advise the Office of Tourism to achieve its purpose under section 13090-C.
10	The commission consists of 24 <u>25</u> voting members appointed by the Governor as follows:
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14	A. Three members representing the outdoor sporting interests of the State, including:
16	 One member representing a statewide organization of hunters, anglers and trappers;
18	(2) One member representing the interacts of large
20	(2) One member representing the interests of large landowners; and
22	(3) One member representing a statewide organization of licensed Maine guides;
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26	B. Eight public members who represent their respective regions and have experience in the field or have demonstrated concern for the travel industry; and
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30	C. Thirteen members of major tourism trade associations, including:
32	 At least one member representing a statewide organization of hotels, motels and inns;
34	(2) At least one member representing a statewide
36	organization of restaurants;
38 -	(3) At least one member representing a statewide organization of campground owners;
40	(4) At least one member representing the retail sector
42	in the State;
44	(5) At least one member representing the motorcoach industry;
46	(6) At least one member representing the air
48	transportation industry;

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(7) At least one member representing arts and culturalorganizations; and

4 (8) At least one member representing a statewide organization of children's camps.<u>; and</u>

D. One member representing a statewide organization of agricultural producers.

The terms of the voting members are for 4 years each. The 10 Governor shall fill a vacancy in the membership for any unexpired term. The commissioners, directors or designees of the following 12 state departments or offices shall serve as ex officio, nonvoting members of the commission: the department; the State Planning 14 Office; the Department of Conservation; the Department of Transportation; the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife; 16 the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources; the Department of Education; and the Bureau of Public Improvements. 18The Canadian Affairs Coordinator shall also serve as an ex officio, nonvoting member of the commission. 20 A chair and vice-chair of the commission must be elected annually from the 22 appointed membership.

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SUMMARY

This bill adds a member representing agricultural producers to the Maine Tourism Commission.
