An Act To Waive Continuing Education Requirements and To Provide an Automatic Extension of a License, Certificate or Registration for Mobilized Military Members

Submitted by the Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management pursuant to Joint Rule 204.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §8003, sub-§5, ¶C, as amended by PL 2003, c. 4 204, Pt. B, §1, is further amended to read: б с. The bureau, office, board or commission may: 8 (1) Require all applicants for license or registration renewal to have responded under oath to all inquiries 10 set forth on renewal forms; 12 (2) Require Except as provided in Title 37-B, section 390-A, require applicants for license or registration 14 renewal to present proof of satisfactory completion of continuing professional or occupational education in 16 accordance with each bureau's, office's, board's or commission's rules. Failure to comply with the 18 continuing education rules may, in the bureau's, office's, board's or commission's discretion, result in 20 a decision to deny license or registration renewal or may result in a decision to enter into a consent 22 agreement and probation setting forth terms and conditions to correct the licensee's or registrant's 24 failure to complete continuing education. Terms and conditions of a consent agreement may include requiring 26 completion of increased hours of continuing education, civil penalties, suspension and other terms as the 28 bureau, office, board, commission, the licensee or registrant and the Department of the Attorney General 30 determine appropriate. Notwithstanding any contrary provision set forth in a bureau's, office's, board's or 32 commission's governing law, continuing education requirements may coincide with the license or 34 registration renewal period; Refuse to renew a license or registration or deny 36 (3) a license when the bureau, office, board or commission finds a licensee or registrant to be in noncompliance 38 with a bureau, office, board or commission order or 40 consent agreement; 42 (4) Allow licensees or registrants to hold inactive status licenses or registrations in accordance with 44 each bureau's, office's, board's or commission's rules. The fee for an inactive license or registration may not exceed the statutory fee cap established for 46 the bureau's, office's, board's or commission's license or registration renewal set forth in its governing law; 48 or 50

(5) Delegate to staff the authority to review and applications for licensure 2 approve pursuant to procedures and criteria established by rule. Rules developed pursuant to this subparagraph are routine 4 technical rules as described in Title 5, chapter 375, 6 subchapter 2-A.

Sec. 2. 37-B MRSA §390-A is enacted to read:

\$390-A. Waiver of continuing education requirements; extension 10 of license, certificate or registration

1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, "active duty for a period of more 14 than 30 days" has the same meaning as in 10 United States Code,

Waiver of continuing education requirements. 18 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a person who is a 20 member of the National Guard or the Reserves of the United States Armed Forces under an order to active duty for a period of more 22 than 30 days and who was licensed, registered or certified to engage in a profession or occupation prior to entering into active duty for a period of more than 30 days may not be required 24 to complete the continuing education requirements for that profession or occupation for any licensing, registration or 26 certification period during that period of active duty and for 6 months after that person is released from active duty. 28

30 3. Automatic extension of license, certificate or registration. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a 32 person who is a member of the National Guard or the Reserves of the United States Armed Forces under an order to active duty for a period of more than 30 days and who was licensed, certified or 34 registered to engage in a profession or occupation prior to being called to active duty for a period of more than 30 days and whose 36 license, certificate or registration expires during that period of active duty must have that license, certificate or 38 registration automatically extended for the period of active duty 40 and for 6 months after that person has been released from active duty. 42

- 4. Limited application. This section applies only if the 44 member's service is in support of:

- A. An operational mission for which members of the Reserves of the United States Armed Forces have been ordered to 48 active duty without their consent; or

2 4	B. Forces activated during a period of war declared by the United States Congress or a period of national emergency declared by the President of the United States or the United States Congress.

10	This bill provides a waiver of continuing education requirements for licenses, certifications and registrations of
12	mobilized members of the military during a mobilization period and for 6 months thereafter. It also extends licenses,
14	certificates and registrations to engage in a profession or occupation for mobilized military members during a mobilization
