	Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts of the Legislature do not
2	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

	Health Insurance Fund associated with General Fund contributions

28	Fund Compensation and Benefit Plan account within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services. Sixty percent in
30	excess equity associated with the Highway Fund must be transferred to the Highway Fund Compensation and Benefit Plan
