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Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission To Study Eliminating the Normal Retirement Age for Corrections Officers and Mental Health Workers, referred to in this resolve as "the commission," is established; and be it further

- Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of 9 members appointed as follows:
- 10 1. Two members of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate; 12
- Three members of the House of Representatives, appointed
 by the Speaker of the House;
- 16 3. One member representing corrections officers, appointed by the President of the Senate; 18
- One member representing employers of mental health
 workers, appointed by the President of the Senate;
- 22 5. One member representing employers of corrections officers, appointed by the Speaker of the House; and

SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill and makes it a resolve. It 8 creates the Commission To Study Eliminating the Normal Retirement Age for Corrections Officers and Mental Health Workers for the purpose of studying whether corrections officers and mental 10 health workers should receive uniform benefits and be eligible to 12 retire after 25 years of service without a reduction in benefits regardless of age. Membership of the commission includes representatives of corrections officers and mental health workers 14 The commission is authorized to submit and 5 Legislators. legislation to the First Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature 16 by November 1, 2006.

Legislative Study

The projected costs to fund the general operating expenses of the Commission to Study Eliminating the Normal Retirement Age for Corrections Officers and Mental Health Workers is \$2,900 in fiscal year 2006-07. The Legislature's budget for legislative studies is \$20,000 for fiscal year 2006-07. Whether this amount is sufficient to fund all studies will depend on the number of studies authorized by the Legislative Council and the Legislature.

If, during the course of the Commission's work, the services of the Maine State Retirement System's actuary is needed, there will be additional costs to the Retirement System associated with the actuarial fees. The amount, and the ability of the Retirement System to absorb those costs without a General Fund appropriation, can not be determined at this time.
