8	This bill is a concept draft pursuant to Joint Rule 208.
	This concept draft proposes to create parity between
10	retirement benefits for corrections officers and mental health workers by adding direct-care mental health workers in the
12	Department of Health and Human Services to the 1998 Special
-	Plan. Under that plan, a worker qualifies for service retirement
14	benefits if that worker either:
16	1. Is 55 years of age with 10 years of creditable service
	in a covered capacity; or
18	2 Han 25 manus of supplificable sources
20	2. Has 25 years of creditable service.
	In the latter case, the worker is eligible for a reduced
22	benefit.
