Sec. 1. Determination of need for teachers of modern and classical 2 languages. Resolved: That the Department of Education shall determine if there is a shortage of teachers in the areas of modern and classical languages in public and private institutions 4 of learning in this State. If the department determines that there is a shortage, the department shall determine whether any б shortage is the result of a lack of college students selecting language as a field of study or the institutions' failure to 8 retain those teachers. The department shall determine what 10 methods, such as scholarships and grants, may be used to reduce The department shall report back to the Joint the shortage. Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs by January 12 15, 2006 with the department's determination and any necessary implementing legislation. The Joint Standing Committee on 14 Education may report out a bill to the Second Regular Session of 16the 122nd Legislature implementing the recommendations of the department. 18

SUMMARY

22 This resolve requires the Department of Education to determine whether there is a shortage of teachers of classical 24 and modern languages in this State and, if a shortage exists, suggest ways to alleviate the shortage.

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
