#### **New or Expanded Activity**

The requirement that high school students must satisfactorily complete a course of study that includes instruction in the legislative process in order to graduate is a mandate. The cost to individual school units can not be determined at this time. Pursuant to the Mandate Preamble, the two-thirds vote of all members elected to each House exempts the State from the constitutional requirement to fund 90% of the additional local costs.
