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3 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 35-A MRSA §3152, sub-§1**, as amended by PL 1999, c.
5 398, Pt. A, §57 and affected by §§104 and 105, is further amended
6 to read:

7 **1. Increased efficiency.** The Legislature declares and
8 finds that improvements in transmission and distribution utility
9 rate design and related regulatory programs have great potential
10 for reducing the cost of electric utility services to consumers,
11 for encouraging energy conservation and efficient use of existing
12 facilities and for minimizing the need for expensive new electric
13 transmission capacity. It is the purpose of this chapter to:

14 A. Require the commission to relate transmission and
15 distribution rates more closely to the costs of providing
16 transmission and distribution service; and

17 C. Require the commission to consider the ability of
18 low-income residential customers to pay in full for electric
19 services as transmission and distribution rates are
20 redesigned consistent with these policies; and

21 D. Authorize the commission to consider the health of the
22 State's manufacturing economy in determining transmission
23 and distribution utility rate design and the allocation of
24 stranded costs and in the development of state, regional and
25 federal energy policy proceedings.

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29 **SUMMARY**

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32 This bill allows, but does not require, the Public Utilities
33 Commission to consider the health of the State's manufacturing
34 economy in Public Utilities Commission proceedings affecting
35 utility rate design or the allocation of stranded costs and in
36 state, regional and federal energy policy proceedings.
