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SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 289, L.D. 881, Bill, "An Act To Amend the Maine Workers' Compensation Act of 1992 To Facilitate Timely Independent Medical Examinations and Benefit Payments"

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Amend the bill by striking out all of section 1 (page 1, lines 3 to 18 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

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- 'Sec. 1. 39-A MRSA §312, sub-§2, as amended by PL 2005, c. 24, §1, is further amended to read:
- An--independent--medical--examiner--shall 26 Eligibility. render-medical-findings-en-the-medical-condition-of-an-employee 28 and--related---issues--as--specified--under---this--sectionindependent medical examiner in a case may not be the employee's 30 treating health care provider and may not have treated the employee with respect to the injury for which the claim is being 32 made or the benefits are being paid. Nothing in this subsection precludes the selection of a provider authorized to receive reimbursement under section 206 to serve in the capacity of an 34 independent medical examiner. Unless-agreed-upon-by-the-parties, 36 a A physician who has examined an employee on more than 20 occasions at the request of an insurance company, employer or employee in accordance with section 207 during the previous 52 38 weeks is not eligible to serve as an independent medical examiner 40 unless that physician is approved for inclusion on the list created pursuant to subsection 1 by a vote of 3/4 of the total membership of the board. 42
- A physician who does not meet the eligibility requirements of this subsection may serve as an independent medical examiner for a claim if agreed to by the parties to that claim.'

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	This amendment disqualifies a physician from serving as an		
6	independent medical examiner if the physician has examined any employee more than 20 times during the previous 52 weeks at the		
8	request of an insurance company, employer or employee. This disqualification may be waived by a 3/4 vote of the Workers'		
10	Compensation Board.		
12	This amendment also makes technical changes to the statute.
