COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 293, L.D. 885, Bill, "An Act To Discourage Further the Sale of Tobacco to Minors"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 7 by striking out all of the last underlined sentence (page 1, lines 9 to 11 in L.D.)

Further amend the bill by inserting after section 2 the following:

'Sec. 3. 22 MRSA §1547 is enacted to read:

§1547. Tobacco specialty store; entry prohibited for persons under 18 years of age

A person under 18 years of age is prohibited from entering a business licensed as a tobacco specialty store unless accompanied by a parent or legal guardian, regardless of whether smoking is allowed in that store.'

Further amend the bill by inserting after section 4 the following:

'Sec. 5. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

Beginning in fiscal year 2005-06, redirecting revenue from fines assessed by the courts for underage tobacco sales from the Criminal Justice Academy to the Department of the Attorney General will result in an estimated annual increase of \$10,000 in dedicated revenue to the Department of the Attorney General and a corresponding reduction in dedicated revenue to the Maine Criminal Justice Academy within the Department of Public Safety. This bill includes an Other Special Revenue Funds allocation to the Department of the Attorney General of \$10,000 annually and a corresponding deallocation to the Maine Criminal Justice Academy. The new allocation will be used by the Department of the Attorney General to support enforcement and responsible retailing education programs.
