1. Jurisdiction. If the father and mother of a minor	
are living apart, the Probate Court or District Court in	
county or division where either resides, upon complaint of e	<u>ither</u>
and after notice to the other as the court may order, may ma	
order awarding parental rights and responsibilities with re	_
to the child in accordance with this chapter. The jurisdi	
granted by this section is limited by the Uniform Child Cu	<u>stody</u>
<u>Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act, if another state may</u>	have
jurisdiction as provided in that Act.	
2. Attorney's fees. Pending an action under this sec	
a court may order either party to pay to the other party,	
the attorney for the other party, sufficient money for	
defense or prosecution of the action. When entering a	<u>final</u>
order, the court may order either party to pay reaso	nable
attorney's fees.	

This bill authorizes the court to order either party to pay attorney's fees in an action to determine parental rights and responsibilities.
