Resolve, To Establish the Commission To Study the Commitment Process for Persons Adjudged Not Criminally Responsible

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the 2 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, the Commission to Study the Commitment Process for 6 Persons Adjudged Not Criminally Responsible is established; and

8 Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the study may be completed and a 10 report submitted in time for submission to the next legislative session; and

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Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 14 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 16 safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission Study the Commitment Process for Persons Adjudged Not 20 to Criminally Responsible, referred to in this resolve as "the commission," is established; and be it further 22

Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission 24 consists of the following members:

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1. Two Senators, appointed by the President of the Senate, 28 one of whom serves on the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety and one of whom serves on the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services; 30

Two members of the House of Representatives, appointed 32 2. by the Speaker of the House, one of whom serves on the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety and one 34 of whom serves on the Joint Standing Committee on Health and 36 Human Services:

- The Commissioner of Health and Human Services, or the 38 3. commissioner's designee;
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The Attorney General, or the Attorney General's designee; 4.

5. The Commissioner of Public Safety, or the commissioner's 44 designee;

The Commissioner of Corrections, or the commissioner's 46 6. designee; and

One member representing the public interest, appointed 7. 50 by the Governor; and be it further

Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first-named Senate member is the Senate chair of the commission and the first-named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the commission; and be it further

Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of commission. Resolved: 6 That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall 8 notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all 10 appointments have been completed. Within 15 days after appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission; and be it further 12

14 Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall review the judicial and commitment process for persons who are adjudged not 16 criminally responsible by reason of insanity or mental disease or defect. Specifically, the commission shall consider:

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The typical length of time of institutional inpatient
residency for a person who is adjudged not criminally responsible
for the act of murder or manslaughter;

2. The relationship between the Department of Health and 24 Human Services and the Judicial Department concerning the custody 26 murder or manslaughter; and

3. The adequacy of current psychiatric examination requirements for the release or discharge of patients adjudged
not criminally responsible for the act of murder or manslaughter; and be it further

Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; and be it further

Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members 38 of the commission are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 40 and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses 2, related to their attendance at authorized meetings of 42 the commission. Public members not otherwise compensated by their 44 employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses and, upon а 46 demonstration of financial hardship, a per diem equal to the legislative per diem for their attendance at authorized meetings 48 of the commission; and be it further

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than November 2, 2 2005, the commission shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, 4 for presentation to the Second Regular Session of the 122nd 6 Legislature. The commission is authorized to introduce legislation related to its report to the Second Regular Session of the 122nd Legislature at the time of submission of its report; 8 and be it further

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Sec. 9. Extension. Resolved: That, if the commission requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further

Sec. 10. Commission budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the 16commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall 18 administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. 20 The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission's exceeding its approved budget. 22 Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council 24 shall promptly provide the commission chairs and staff with a status report on the commission budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds. 26

28 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.
