2	Sec. 1. 14 MRSA §222 is enacted to read:

	1. Joint and several liability. In an action involving
8	more than one defendant when 2 or more defendants as part of a
	common enterprise or plan act in concert and cause harm, the
10	liability of each defendant for all damages is joint and several.
12	2. Several, not joint liability. In any action involving
	more than one defendant not governed by subsection 1, the
14	liability of each defendant is several only and is not joint.
	Each defendant is liable only for the amount of damages allocated
16	to that defendant in direct proportion to that defendant's
1.0	percentage of negligence, and a separate judgment must be
18	rendered against that defendant for that amount.
20	3. Application. This section does not affect joint and
20	several liability that is explicitly established elsewhere by
22	statute.

	SUMMARY

	This bill modifies joint and several liability among
28	defendants. If 2 or more defendants act in concert to cause harm
	as part of a common enterprise or plan, their liability for the
30	harm is joint and several. In all other cases, liability is
2.2	several, not joint. This change in the law does not apply to
32	joint and several liability that is explicitly established
	elsewhere by statute.
