Resolve, To Establish a Study Commission To Analyze Regulations Applicable to Sewer Districts

Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission 2 to Study and Analyze Regulations Applicable to Sewer Districts, referred to in this resolve as "the commission," is established; 4 and be it further Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: 6 That the commission consists of 5 members appointed as follows: 8 1. One member of the Senate, appointed by the President of 10 the Senate; One member of the House of Representatives, appointed by 12 2. the Speaker of the House; 143. Two members who are superintendents of different-sized 16 sewer districts; and One member 18 4. of the Department of Environmental Protection; and be it further 20 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the Senate member is the Senate chair of the commission and the House of Representatives 22 member is the House chair of the commission; and be it further 24 Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of commission. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the 26 effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all 28 been completed. Within 15 appointments have days after 30 appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission; and be it further 32 Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall examine the following issues concerning the analysis of rules and34 regulations applicable to sewer districts: 36 Review rules and regulations, practices and education 1. requirements of the sewer districts; and 38 Review all testing requirements, especially 40 2. discharge testing, and any other issues the commission determines appropriate; and be it further 42 Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the 44 Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; and 46 be it further 48

Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members of the commission are entitled to receive the legislative per 2 diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses 4 related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. Public members not otherwise compensated by their 6 employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses and, 8 upon a demonstration of financial hardship, a per diem equal to the 10 legislative per diem for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission; and be it further

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than January 17, 2006, the commission shall submit a report that includes its 14findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Second Regular Session of the 122nd 16commission authorized introduce Legislature. The is to legislation related to its report to the Second Regular Session 18 of the 122nd Legislature at the time of submission of its report; 20 and be it further

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22 Sec. 9. Extension. Resolved: That, if the commission requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its 24 report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further

Sec. 10. Commission budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall 28 administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its 30 first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The 32 commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council 34 shall promptly provide the commission chairs and staff with a 36 status report on the commission budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.

SUMMARY

42 This resolve establishes a study commission to analyze rules and regulations applicable to sewer districts, with the authority 44 to report out legislation to the 122nd Legislature in January 2006.
