2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §11152, sub-§7** is enacted to read:

6 7. **Permit not required.** Notwithstanding any other
8 provisions of this section, a person who holds a valid junior
10 hunting license or who is 18 years of age or younger and holds a
12 valid Maine hunting license may take an antlerless deer without a
14 permit.

SUMMARY

This bill allows people 18 years of age and younger who hold valid hunting licenses to hunt any deer without a permit.
