SUMMARY
This amendment replaces the bill.
It builds on the current law under which accepting harness
racing wagers from anyone located in Maine is illegal unless the
person accepting the wager is licensed by the Maine Harness
Racing Commission. Any gambling in Maine that is not
specifically authorized by law is illegal.
This amendment creates a private right of action to enforce

the law with any damages, after the reasonable costs of suit, to

be divided among the State's funds to provide for Maine's extended meets, harness racing purses, Maine's commercial tracks and Maine's off-track betting facilities. The damages are intended to make up for the lost revenues experienced in Maine's harness racing industry because of electronic wagering that is not subject to the taxes placed on wagers legally placed in Maine. Punitive damages are authorized for violations after written notice of the provisions of this section.
