An Act To Improve the Recruitment of Teachers

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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	Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §13402, sub-§§7 and 8 are enacted to read:
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	7. Minimum salary. A teacher certified under chapter 501
6	may not receive an annual salary in an amount that is less than
	1.5 times the federal nonfarm income official poverty line, as
8	defined by the federal Office of Management and Budget, for a
	family of 3.

	8. Master's degrees. A teacher certified under chapter 501
12	who has a master's degree or higher may not receive an annual
	salary in an amount that is less than 1.5 times the federal
14	nonfarm income official poverty line, as defined by the federal
	Office of Management and Budget, for a family of 3 plus \$2,000.
