22	This bill requires all retail liquor licensees to display a
	sign in a conspicuous location at the licensed premises informing
24	customers of the prohibition of the purchase of liquor by or the
	sale of liquor to minors or visibly intoxicated persons, and
26	requires the Commissioner of Public Safety to create the sign and
	distribute it to all retail liquor licensees
