34	Services to report on use of antibiotics. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources, referred
36	to in this resolve as "the commissioner," and the Director of the Bureau of Health within the Department of Health and Human
38	Services, referred to in this resolve as "the director," shall examine ways to reduce the use of antibiotics in the animal
40	industry with the goal of maintaining the therapeutic efficacy of antibiotics. The commissioner and the director shall convene a
42	study group to review the use of antibiotics in animal agriculture, with particular attention to those antibiotics also
44	used in human medicine. The study group may also make recommendations for future actions that encourage prudent use of
