continue to provide technical assistance, as well as grants,

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incentives and direct financial assistance to the municipalities
participating in the pilot project. A timeline is provided for
the development and submission of proposals and the design and
implementation of the municipal service districts. Funding is
provided through the Fund for the Efficient Delivery of Local and
Regional Services and a separate appropriation.

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
