An Act Directing the State Planning Office To Study Municipal Capabilities To Become Providers of Internet Services

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §2101, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 737, Pt.
A, §2 and Pt. C, §106 and amended by PL 1989, c. 6, c. 9, §2 and c. 104, Pt. C, §§8 and 10, is further amended to read:

§2101. Purpose

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The purpose of this chapter is to implement the home rule powers granted to municipalities by the Constitution of Maine, Article VIII, Part Second. <u>Unless otherwise prohibited by law</u>, <u>nothing in the chapter may be construed to restrict a</u> <u>municipality's authority to become a provider of wireless</u> <u>14</u> Internet access.

Sec. 2. Study and report of municipal capabilities to become 16 providers of Internet services. The Executive Department, State in conjunction with the Public Planning Office, Utilities 18 Commission and theDepartment of Economic anđ Community Development, shall study the following: the technology available 20 for creating wireless Internet access throughout rural and urban municipalities in the State and its estimated cost; the various 22 strategic partnerships that may funding resources and be available to municipalities to deliver wireless Internet services 24 to their communities; and the long-term educational and economic benefits that could be derived from municipalities' becoming 26 Internet service providers and the benefits to the State. The State Planning Office shall submit a report on its findings to 28 the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities and Energy no later than September 12, 2005. The joint standing committee of the 30 Legislature having jurisdiction over telecommunications matters may report out a bill to the First Regular Session of the 123rd 32 Legislature in response to the report. 34

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SUMMARY

38 This bill clarifies that municipalities have the authority to become providers of wireless Internet services and requires the Executive Department, State Planning Office, in conjunction 40 with the Public Utilities Commission and the Department of to study the economic, Economic and Community Development, 42 technological and funding issues associated with municipalities' providing wireless Internet services to their communities. The 44 bill requires the State Planning Office to submit a report on its findings to the joint standing committee of the Legislature 46 telecommunications and having jurisdiction over matters authorizes the committee to report out a bill after reviewing the 48 report.
