8	The state heritage fish is the eastern brook trout, Salvelinus fontinalis.
10	Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §12461 is enacted to read:
12	§12461. Unstocked brook trout waters
14	A water listed in the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife report of March 1996 entitled "Administrative Policy
16	Regarding Native Salmonid Management" as a Maine lake or pond with a native brook trout population with no record of having
18	been stocked since 1937 may not be stocked with interspecific or intraspecific predator, prey or competitor fish species from any
20	hatchery or wild source without legislative approval.

26	This bill names the eastern brook trout as the State's heritage fish and forbids without legislative approval the stocking of any brook trout water listed by the Department of
28	Inland Fisheries and Wildlife as having not been stocked since 1937.
