An Act To Ensure Implementation of All Content Areas of the System of Learning Results

The commissioner shall conduct a review 10 of the content standards and performance indicators by content area on a 4-year cycle beginning in the 2003-2004 school year. 12 Any changes that are recommended must be approved through the same process used for establishment of the system of learning 14 If the commissioner finds that additional funds are results. required to implement the system of learning results in the 16 subject areas of career preparation, foreign languages and visual and performing arts, the commissioner shall review and estimate 18 the potential costs of implementation. The commissioner shall also make recommendations to the joint standing committee of the 20 Legislature having jurisdiction over education and cultural affairs on establishing a date and timelines by which all school 22 administrative units must implement learning results in all subject areas. 24 **SUMMARY** 26 28 This bill repeals a provision that allowed a school administrative unit to delay adoption of the system of learning results in the areas of career preparation, foreign languages and 30

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visual and performing arts, requiring all subject areas in the 32 system of learning results to be implemented. School administrative units must employ an orderly planning process to 34 achieve implementation on time.
