An Act To Reduce School Construction Costs

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §15905, sub-§4-A is enacted to read:

| 8 | establish standard school construction plans for small, medium |
| | and large elementary schools, middle schools and high schools. |

| 12 | administrative unit that proposes to build a school using the |

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| 22 | This bill requires the State Board of Education to adopt |
| | when to define what constituted small medium and large |

rules to define what constitutes small, medium and large schools. The state board is required to develop standard school 24 construction plans for small, medium and large elementary schools, middle schools and high schools. A school 26 administrative unit that applies for state support for new school construction must select the standard design for the construction 28 of the new school in order to have the project fully funded.
