### An Act To Expunge Criminal Records upon Pardon

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 15 MRSA §2167, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 665, §1, is 4 amended to read:

#### 6 §2167. Expungement of records

8 In any criminal case in which the Governor grants a convicted person a full and free pardon, that-person, -after-the 10 expiration-of--10-years-from-the-date-the person-is-finally discharged--from--any--sentence--imposed--as--a--result--of--the 12 eenvietion, -- may -- make -- written - application -to the Department of Public Safety, State Bureau of Identification te-have and any 14 other state agency shall expunge all references to the pardoned crime deleted from the -- Federal -- Bureau -- of -- Investigation's 16 identification-record all state records. Following-receipt-of-an applieation,-the The State Bureau of Investigation Identification 18 shall make the necessary arrangements with the identification division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation to have all 20 references to the pardoned crime deleted from the Federal Bureau of Investigation's identification record and any state materials 22 returned to the contributing agency if-the application-is-timely and-the-person-has-not-been-convicted of a crime in this State or 24 any-other-jurisdiction-since the full and free -pardon -was -granted and-has-no-formal-charging-instrument-for-a-crime-pending-in-this 26 State-or-any-other-jurisdiction.

#### SUMMARY

This bill requires the Department of Public Safety, State 32 Bureau of Identification and all other state agencies to expunge all records of a crime of a person who has received a full and 34 free pardon by the Governor. This bill also requires the State Bureau of Identification to make the necessary arrangements with 36 the identification division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation to have all references to the pardoned crime deleted from the Federal Bureau of Investigation's identification 38 record and any state materials returned to the contributing 40 agency.
