	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. P&SL 1911, c. 142, §2-G is enacted to read:
4	Sec. 2-G. Authority to take water. The corporation is
6	authorized to take, hold and convey in the Town of Farmington
_	water from any surface and groundwater source in the town.
8	Sec. 2. P&SL 1911, c. 142, §11-A is enacted to read:
10	Sec. 11-A. Rates. The rates of Farmington Village Corporation
12	must be established in accordance with the Maine Revised
	Statutes, Title 35-A, chapter 61. The rates must be sufficient
14	to provide revenue to Farmington Village Corporation to carry out
	the purposes of its incorporation, without the need for any
16	financial assistance from any municipality, other than the normal
	payment of water charges for services rendered and any loan or
18	<u>loans provided to Farmington Village Corporation for initial</u>
	funds as set forth in Title 35-A, section 6412. All customers of
20	Farmington Village Corporation shall pay to the treasurer or
	other designated officer of Farmington Village Corporation the
22	rates established by Farmington Village Corporation.
24	Sec. 3. P&SL 1985, c. 141 is repealed.
26	Sec. 4. Retroactivity. That section of this Act that enacts
	Private and Special Law 1911, chapter 142, section 11-A applies
2.8	retroactively to March 20, 1911.

	This bill amends the charter of the Farmington Village
34	Corporation by giving the corporation authority to take water in
	the Town of Farmington and to establish rates and repeals the section of the charter that limits the situations in which the
36	corporation may lease its property. The bill also makes the
38	authority to establish rates retroactive to 1911, which is the
	date of the corporation's new charter.
