Resolve, To Fund a Group Home for Young Adults with Disabilities in Southern Maine

(EMERGENCY)

Cosponsored by Representative MERRILL of Appleton and Senators: BROMLEY of Cumberland, MAYO of Sagadahoc, Representatives: BARSTOW of Gorham, HOGAN of Old Orchard Beach, PINGREE of North Haven. **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the 2 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, the needs of young adults with disabilities in southern Maine are not currently being met in an appropriate community setting; and

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Whereas, this legislation requires the establishment of at least one residential facility for young adults with disabilities by October 1, 2005; and

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Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Establish residential facility. Resolved: That, by October 20 1, 2005, the Department of Health and Human Services shall establish at least one facility in Southern Maine to serve as a residential facility for up to 6 adult individuals, 21 to 25 22 years of age, referred to in this resolve as "individuals," who 24 are in need of continuous care to treat their physical disabilities and who would otherwise be eligible for treatment in 26 a nursing facility. In the residential facility established pursuant to this resolve, the department may permit the 6 individuals to flexibly share the personal care, nursing and 28 other home health services to which they would otherwise be eligible in a manner that jointly meets their medical needs; and 30 be it further

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Sec. 2. Funding. Resolved: That the Department of Health and 34 Human Services shall seek to establish and operate the residential facility required under section 1 within the department's existing resources. For purposes of this section, 36 "existing resources" includes money, such as funds associated with MaineCare and other state and federal programs, and private 38 insurance that would otherwise be spent for the individual's 40 nursing facility and home health care. If the department finds that existing resources are not sufficient to establish and operate the residential facility, the department is authorized to 42 submit a bill to request an appropriation not to exceed \$80,000 44 in General Fund dollars, per year, for this purpose; and be it further 46

Sec. 3. Report. Resolved: That, by February 1, 2006, the Department of Health and Human Services shall report to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services on the status of the residential facility required in section 1, its costs and the extent to which it can be used as a model to develop additional community placements for disabled individuals.

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Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

SUMMARY

10 This resolve directs the Department of Health and Human Services to establish a facility in southern Maine to serve as a residential facility for young adults who are in need of continuous care to treat their physical disabilities and who 12 14 would otherwise be eligible for treatment in a nursing facility. The resolve directs the department to seek to establish and 16 operate this facility within existing resources but authorizes the department to seek an appropriation should existing resources 18 not be sufficient. It further directs the department to report on the status of the residential facility, its costs and the 20 extent to which it can be used as a model to develop additional community placements for disabled individuals.
