Resolve, Creating a Working Group To Study the High Rate of Suicide in Maine

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the 2 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, this resolve establishes the Working Group to Study 6 the High Rate of Suicide in Maine; and

8 Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the study may be completed and a 10 report submitted in time for submission to the next legislative session; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Working group established. Resolved: That the Working Group to Study the High Rate of Suicide in Maine, referred to in this resolve as "the working group," is established; and be it further

- 24 Sec. 2. Working group membership. Resolved: That the working group consists of 11 members appointed as follows:
- One member from the Senate, appointed by the President
 of the Senate;
- 30 2. Two members from the House, appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- 3. Three members representing suicide prevention groups, 2 34 appointed by the President of the Senate and one appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- 4. One member who is a guidance counselor, appointed by the 38 President of the Senate;
- 40 5. One member who is a medical person knowledgeable about drugs appointed by the Speaker of the House;

6. One member who is suicide counselor, appointed by the 44 President of the Senate;

46 7. The Commissioner of Health and Human Services, or the commissioner's designee; and

8. The Attorney General or the Attorney General's designee; 50 and be it further 2 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the Senate member is the Senate chair of the working group and the first-named House of 4 Representatives member is the House chair of the working group; and be it further

Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of working group. Resolved: 8 That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of 10 the Legislative Council once all appointments have been completed. Within 15 days after appointment of all members, the chairs shall 12 call and convene the first meeting of the working group; and be it further 14

16 Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the working group shall hold meetings at various locations in the State to be determined by 18 the chairs. The working group shall develop a statewide strategic plan to address the suicide problem in the State. In 20 conducting its study, the working group shall:

22 1. Establish a statewide preventative mentoring and buddy program to help troubled individuals;

2. Develop or strengthen statewide communications on the topic;

30 4. Establish a yearly conference; and be it further

32 Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis 34 shall provide necessary staffing services to the working group; and be it further

Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members of the working group are entitled to receive the legislative per 38 diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses 40 related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the working 42 group. Public members not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to 44 receive reimbursement of necessary expenses and, upon а demonstration of financial hardship, a per diem equal to the legislative per diem for their attendance at authorized meetings 46 of the working group; and be it further

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 7, 2005, the working group shall submit a report that includes its

findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation,
for presentation to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and
Human Services and the Legislative Council. The working group is
not authorized to introduce legislation. Following receipt and
review of the report, the Joint Standing Committee on Health and
Human Services may report out a bill to the Second Regular
Session of the 122nd Legislature; and be it further

Sec. 9. Extension. Resolved: That, if the working group requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further

Sec. 10. Working group budget. Resolved: That the chairs of 14 the working group, with assistance from the working group staff, shall administer the working group's budget. Within 10 days 16 after its first meeting, the working group shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its 18 The working group may not incur expenses that would approval. 20 result in the working group's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the working group, the Executive Director of 22 the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the working group chairs and staff with a status report on the working group 24 budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

SUMMARY

32 This resolve establishes a working group to study the high rate of suicide in Maine. The working group shall submit its 34 report to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services by December 7, 2005.
