Resolve, To Create the Task Force To Study Commercial Lobster Fishing in Offshore Waters

- Sec. 1. Task force established. Resolved: That the Task Force to

 Study Commercial Lobster Fishing in Offshore Waters, referred to
 in this resolve as "the task force," is established; and be it

 further
 - Sec. 2. Task force membership. Resolved: That the task force consists of 11 members appointed as follows:

1. One member of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate. When making the appointment, the President of the Senate shall give preference to members who serve on the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources;

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- 2. Two members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House. When making the appointments, the Speaker of the House shall give preference to members who serve on the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources;
- 3. One person representing the Lobster Advisory Council, 20 established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 12004-I, subsection 58, appointed by the President of the Senate, 22 upon recommendation of the chair of the Lobster Advisory Council;
- 4. One person representing the Lobster Promotion Council, established in Title 12, section 6455, appointed by the President of the Senate, upon recommendation of the chair of the Lobster Promotion Council;
 - 5. Three persons representing lobster management policy councils, established under Title 12, section 6447, appointed by the Speaker of the House, upon recommendation of the Commissioner of Marine Resources; each person must represent a different lobster management zone;
 - 6. Two persons, each of whom must hold a Maine lobster and crab fishing license and a federal permit to fish in federal Offshore Lobster Management Area 3, as defined by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, National Marine Fisheries Service, appointed by the Commissioner of Marine Resources; and
- 7. One person who is a marine scientist with expertise in lobsters, appointed by the Commissioner of Marine Resources.
- One of the legislative members of the task force must be the Legislator currently serving on the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission. The composition of the task force must reflect a geographical distribution along the coast; and be it further

Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first-named Senate member is the Senate chair of the task force and the first-named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the task force; and be it further

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Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of task force. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all appointments have been completed. Within 15 days after appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the task force; and be it further

Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the task force shall:

- 1. Identify and investigate problems facing persons who hold Maine lobster and crab fishing licenses who fish for lobsters in federal waters, with particular attention to issues related to fishing in federal Offshore Lobster Management Area 3, as defined by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, National Marine Fisheries Service;
- 2. Review the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission's Interstate Fishery Management Plan for American Lobster and federal and state law and rules and regulations relevant to commercial lobster fishing in offshore waters;
- 3. Invite public comments and testimony regarding the subject of commercial lobster fishing in offshore waters; and
- Develop recommendations, including suggested legislation, to address identified problems; and be it further
- Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the task force; and be it further
- Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members of the task force are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the task force. Public members not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses and, upon a demonstration of financial hardship, a per diem equal to the legislative per diem for their attendance at authorized meetings of the task force; and be it further

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than January 1, 2006, the task force shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources and the Legislative Council. The task force is authorized to introduce a bill related to its report to the Second Regular Session of the 122nd Legislature at the time of submission of its report; and be it further

Sec. 9. Extension. Resolved: That, if the task force requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further

Sec. 10. Task force budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the task force, with assistance from the task force staff, shall administer the task force's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the task force shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The task force may not incur expenses that would result in the task force's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the task force, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the task force chairs and staff with a status report on the task force budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.

SUMMARY

This resolve establishes the Task Force to Study Commercial Lobster Fishing in Offshore Waters. The task force is directed to identify and investigate problems facing people in the State licensed to fish for lobster in federal waters, with particular attention to issues related to fishing in federal Offshore Lobster Management Area 3, and to develop recommendations to address identified problems. The task force is required to submit a report by January 1, 2006 and is authorized to introduce legislation related to its report to the Second Regular Session of the 122nd Legislature.
