- Provide information. The operator of a watercraft
 involved in a collision or accident that results in property
 damage estimated to be in an amount of \$1,000 or more shall
 provide the owner or operator of that property:

12 A. The operator's name and address; and

- 14 B. The registration number of the operator's watercraft.
- 16 2. Render assistance. The operator of a watercraft involved in an accident shall render reasonable assistance to all persons involved in the accident as far as the operator can without serious damage to the operator's watercraft or serious 20 risk to crew or passengers.

<u>§13069-C. Watercraft accident reports</u>

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A person shall report a watercraft accident to the 28 commissioner in accordance with this section.

 Injury to person. An operator or owner of a watercraft involved in a collision, accident or other casualty while using the watercraft that results in the death of a person, a person's losing consciousness or receiving medical treatment, a person's becoming disabled for more than 24 hours or the disappearence of a person from a watercraft under circumstances indicating death or injury shall file a written report on forms provided by the commissioner containing the information as required by the source commissioner within 24 hours of the occurrence.

- 2. Damage to watercraft. Accidents involving only damage to watercraft or other property to the estimated amount of \$1,000
 or more must be reported within 72 hours on forms provided by the commissioner.

SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill and provides that an operator involved in a watercraft, snowmobile or ATV accident who intentionally, knowingly or recklessly fails to provide that operator's name, address and the registration number of that operator's recreational vehicle or fails to render reasonable aid to injured persons commits a Class C crime. The amendment also corrects several cross-references and repeals certain provisions of current law and enacts substantially similar provisions in reorganized form.
